Objectives / Credits

Intended Audience

This conference is intended for primary care physicians, physician assistants, nurses, advance practice nurses, other interested health care practitioners, and patients and family members afflicted with scoliosis.

Statement of Need

One percent of all individuals have at least mild scoliosis and 30 percent of all adolescents may be afflicted with other spinal disorders including back pain. The purpose of this instructional course is to provide education about the management of scoliosis and its importance in children and adolescents. Additional information on the diagnosis and treatment of other common spinal disorders that may cause back pain will also be provided. Subject material will be presented in a parallel fashion accommodating the educational needs of health care practitioners as well as patients and family members afflicted with scoliosis.

Learning Objectives

At the end of this conference, health care practitioners will:

- Become expert in understanding the etiology, natural history, diagnosis and management of idiopathic scoliosis;
- Be able to recognize, treat and appropriately refer patients with other forms of scoliosis, Scheuermann's kyphosis, spondylolisthesis and other common disorders of the growing spine; and
- Become facile in the diagnosis and management of back pain in the pediatric, adolescent and young adult patient.

At the end of this conference, patients and family members will:

- Recognize the important features of the natural history and management options for their idiopathic scoliosis;
- Learn what to expect from patients and family members who have previously been treated for idiopathic scoliosis; and
- Understand and incorporate information for maintaining a healthy and pain-free back.
