Program News



Dear Alumni:

This past year certainly flew by as the PT Program prepared its self-study (and everything that goes along with it!) for the Program's upcoming accreditation site visit October 22–25, 2000. It seems that we were able to put the finishing touches on the developmental phase of what we perceive to be a new and improved UW–Madison Physical Therapy Program!

In the spring, the Program received approval from campus to add four credits to its cur-

riculum. PT 501: *Anatomical Applications in Physical Therapy*, a one-credit course emphasizing palpation, movement analysis and medical terminology, will be taught during the first summer semester in conjunction with Human Anatomy. One credit has been added to *Neuromusculoskeletal Bases of Movement*, whose number has been changed from PT 634 to PT 627 to more adequately reflect its placement in the curriculum. The course num-

ber for *Musculoskeletal Assessment and Treatment I* has also been changed from PT 522 to PT 676 to reflect its location in the curriculum within the second-year orthopedic tract. PT 665 has expanded into a two-credit course entitled *Clinical Pathology: Implications for Physical Therapy*. PT 799: *Independent Study* has been added to the curriculum as an elective for those students interested in pursuing specific content areas at a greater depth than that which is taught in required courses.

These final curricular changes and additions were just in time for us to fulfill our next exciting endeavor—the hiring of **William Boissonnault, PT, MSc, DPT** as a Tenure Track Assistant Professor. Dr. Boissonnault will teach PT 665: *Pathology: Implications for Physical Therapy*, PT 676: *Musculoskeletal Assessment and*

Treatment I, and will coordinate PT 642: *Research Practicum*. He will also research the use of self-administered questionnaires to collect medical history information; the impact of co-morbidities and medication use on functional outcomes in different patient populations; and clinical residency education. A synopsis of Dr. Boissonnault's background and achievements can be found in the Faculty News section of this newsletter.

Another recent significant event was this year's Visiting Lecturer: **Pamela Duncan, PT, PhD, FAPTA**. Dr. Duncan's presentation on an

Class Updates

The UW–Madison PT Program’s first class of master’s graduates, the Class of 1999, demonstrated a stellar performance on the National PT Examination, exhibiting a pass rate well above both state and national averages.

After completing the didactic portion of the PT Program, the Class of 2000 celebrated with a graduation banquet before embarking on their three eight-week final internships.

The Class of 2001 participated in a four-week clinical experience following the completion of their first year, and are now enjoying their last “free” summer!

The 40 members of the Class of 2002 began their program of study on June 12, 2000 with a welcome orientation by Program faculty and staff.

Activities

On February 19, 2000, students from the UW–Madison PT Program and the Blackhawk Technical College PTA Program organized and hosted a very successful Wisconsin Student Conclave on the UW–Madison campus. Approximately 150 students representing Wisconsin PT and PTA programs gathered to

Faculty News



Our Newest Faculty Member... William Boissonnault

William Boissonnault, PT, MSc, DPT, received his BS in PT from UW-Madison in 1977, his MSc in 1982 and his DPT in 1999, both from the University of St. Augustine for Health Sciences.

He has served as the rehabilitation team supervisor of orthopaedic services at UWHC for the past 3 years,

and was director of the spine clinic at UWHC Research Park for the preceding 5 years.

Dr. Boissonnault was selected by the APTA Board of Directors to give the John HP Maley Lecture at the APTA Annual Conference in June 2000, where his lecture was entitled "Differential Diagnosis: Taking a Step Back Before Stepping Forward." He is a past recipient of the WPTA Clinical Excellence Award and the University of St. Augustine Distinguished Alumni Award.

Dr. Boissonnault is president of the APTA Orthopaedic Section, vice president of the *Journal*

of *Orthopaedic and Sports Therapy*, and a fellow of the American Academy of Orthopaedic Manual Physical Therapists. He was appointed by the APTA Board of Directors to chair a task force on the credentialing of clinical residency programs and helped establish the UWHC/Meriter Hospital Orthopaedic PT Clinical Residency Program, which was recently credentialed.

In addition to authoring numerous publications, Dr. Boissonnault is co-editor of and contributor to the textbooks *Examination in PT Practice—Screening for Medical Disease* and *Pathology: Implications for the PT*. He has presented over 100 continuing education courses on PT differential diagnosis and medical screening at state, national, and international conferences. He is also an adjunct faculty member at the University of St. Augustine, the University of Tennessee-Memphis, the University of Indianapolis, and Massachusetts General Hospital.

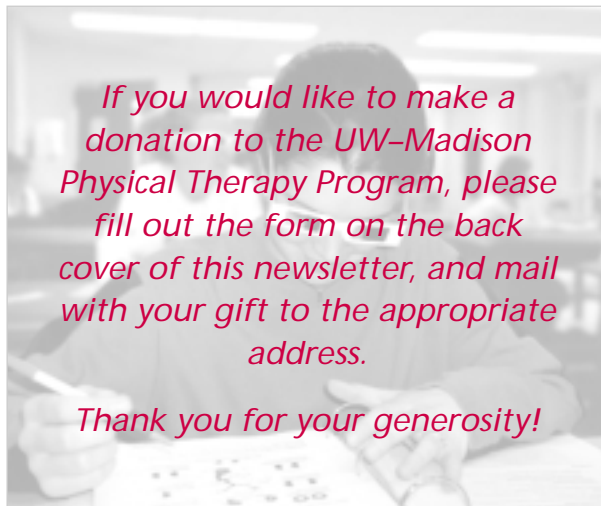
